2022 NWLC REPORT

The 2022 ABWA NWLC was held in Westminster Colorado, September 8–10, 2022. Attending from the Oceanside Charter Chapter were Patricia Worrow, Cindy Schmitt, Anita Carbone, Sheryl Glore, Cindy Grossman, and Kristen Heath. This conference concentrated on national recognition and professional development. There were 327 attendees.

National recognition included introduction of the 2023 Top 10 Business Women as well as the announcement of the 2023 American Business Woman, Amber Clark. The ABWA-KU MBA Essentials graduates were recognized as well as ABWA's best practicing leagues. There were 29 chapters receiving Best Practices Level I, II or III awards. The Oceanside Charter Chapter was one of only six chapters nationwide to receive Best Practices Level I.

Professional development courses offered included "Enhance Your Personal Persona," "Developing Your Visual IQ," and "Fundamental Beliefs of Trust" presented by University of Kansas/School of Business, Franklin Covey, and The Grove Consultants International.

We were treated to four outstanding keynote speakers:

Tamara Ghandour, "Moving at the Speed of Innovation" offered insight on building and leading high-performing teams of innovators, especially in times of change. Three agreements from her leader's playbook include: 1) have an open mind, 2) engage, and 3) give yourself permission to imagine. She explained the importance of understanding what problems our clients are facing by using the phrase, "Tell me more," which allows the speaker to provide a deeper level of explanation and prevents us from jumping to a premature conclusion. Whether you are an individual or a member of a team, innovation is your greatest competitive advantage.

Tracy Latourrette, "Top Gun Leaders, Top Gun Life" delivered an exciting and inspirational message about her journey to becoming Colorado's first female fighter pilot. She

presented the tools to establish our own personal VECTOR, conveyed the power of never giving up and how to prevail in a male dominated industry. Tracy explained that we must do what is hard, in order to achieve what is great. "Leaders who listen, get more done than bosses who bark." With these components put into place we are able to succeed in hitting our targets at work and at home.

Sarah Moshman, "Being Bold and Naïve" presented her insights as an Emmy Awardwinning documentary filmmaker, TV Producer, and TEDx speaker. She spoke about her experiences filming "The Empowerment Project: Ordinary Women Doing Extraordinary Things" which involved 5 women driving over 7,000 miles across the country in 30 days to document 17 women's lives across a variety of industries and lifestyles. She learned that "everyone has their own Pacific to cross." Today, Sarah is an inspirational visionary who speaks about taking risks despite adversity. Sara had us ask ourselves what we could achieve if we were not afraid to fail. Additional words of wisdom were," Sometimes you climb the ladder of success only to find out it's on the wrong wall," and "You can never cross the ocean unless you have the courage to lose sight of the shore."

Eddie Slowikowski, "Becoming the 'Better' Version of You" presented his personal stories to explain his "4 Minute Formula for Success." This formula is a nod to him becoming the 169th American to break the 4-minute mile. His 7 steps to success are:


- 1. Define what you want and why you want it.
- 2. You must believe that what you want is possible
- 3. Identify your team, discover the people that will help you along the way.
- 4. Design and implement your game plan.
- 5. Prepare for the pain, learn to adapt and innovate while developing resiliency.
- 6. Set your destination point, when will you be done?
- 7. Give back to our world, be of service.

The 2022 NWLC was the first in-person conference to be held since 2019. It was wonderful to meet with ABWA sisters from across the nation face-to-face again. In the words of two of our first-time attendees. Kristen Heath and Cindy Grossman, "Don't miss the next National Women's Leadership Conference! Whether your aspirations with ABWA are to become extremely involved or just touch the surface, after experiencing the organization in full force at the conference you will be inspired. ABWA is not only an incredible sisterhood, it also brings together likeminded women with different occupations, diversity and ages. ABWA encourages individual growth through leadership, education, network support and national recognition."


