



National recognition included introduction of the 2024 Top 10 Business Women as well as the announcement of the 2024 American Business Woman, Doris Harrison. At the Best Practices ceremony, the Oceanside Charter Chapter was recognized with the Best Practices Level I award, as well as recognized for achieving the highest level of membership recruitment.

Professional development sessions presented by the Franklin Covey team included "Catalyze Your Leadership" and "Inclusive Leadership-Practical Ways to Cultivate Inclusion and Build a Better Team." This presentation focused on the importance of fostering a workplace experience where each person feels seen, valued and understood by their leader and by all members of the team. To accomplish this, map your team by asking connection questions such as identity and experience, work style, personality and culture, professional growth goals, and what

their skills and interests are. In addition, it is always important to find out what is going on in their life and well-being.

On Thursday, October 5th, Keynote Speaker Morgan Wider taught the audience that we are worthy, and that we should dress like it. She told three inspiring stories of women with low self-confidence who she assisted through the power of wardrobe. Showing just how powerful the words we say to ourselves can Morgan led the audience in Hoʻoponopono, a Hawaiian teaching about forgiveness by reciting the words "I'm sorry. Please forgive me. I thank you. I love you." Through Morgan's presentation, the audience learned that dressing professionally does not have to mean dressing in all black and that showing up for yourself goes much further than your wardrobe!
