

\$2000 IMPACT SCHOLARSHIP

Oceanside Charter Chapter is pleased to announce a scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 funded through the Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund to be awarded to a deserving female student.

Each year, local chapters of ABWA provide Stephen Bufton Memorial Scholarships (SBMEF) to female students who will be attending accredited U.S. colleges, universities and community/vocational schools. Applicants for the \$2,000 Impact Scholarship must be citizens of the United States; residents of Brevard County; and enrolled in a licensed, accredited or state approved community college, technical or vocational school, or college/university in August 20234 with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Eligible women interested in applying for the scholarship must contact Anita Carbone at acarbone@cfl.rr.com to request registration as a candidate for the scholarship.

Applications must be completed online at foundation. It has the same tax status as www.sbmef.org by April 15, 2024. The scholarship recipient will be notified in June 2024.

New Small Business Compliance Issue in 2024



The U.S. Treasury Financial Crimes Division now requires most small businesses with under 20 employees and less than \$5,000,000 in revenue to file Beneficial Ownership Information.

If you own, operate, or are an officer or decision maker for a limited liability company or corporation, then there is a high likelihood this law applies to you and compliance is mandatory unless your company is exempt.
